WCAG 2.2.2 Pause, Stop, Hide (Level A): When two users collaborate on a shared NoodleTools project, real-time activity messages about the other user's actions are displayed but cannot be paused, stopped, or hidden by the receiving user.	Open	Planned	To be determined	Users can coordinate work sessions offline to avoid simultaneous editing. Alternatively, each collaborator can work on their own separate copy of the project and merge changes manually.	Affects only the real-time collaboration feature. Notification messages are informational and transient; they disappear automatically and do not block use of the product.

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WCAG 1.3.4 Orientation (Level AA, WCAG 2.1 and 2.2): NoodleTools requires Landscape orientation on mobile phones and tablets. Users who have their device orientation locked to Portrait mode (e.g., for accessibility or physical reasons) cannot use the application in Portrait mode.	Open	Deferred	Under evaluation; no firm date at this time	Users on mobile devices should unlock device orientation and switch to Landscape mode. NoodleTools is primarily designed for desktop and laptop use; mobile users are encouraged to access the application from a desktop browser where possible.	The workspace layout requires a minimum viewport width to function effectively. Supporting Portrait mode on small-screen devices would require a significant UI redesign. Desktop and laptop users are not affected by this limitation.
Non-Web Document Export — Missing Alt Text for User-Inserted Images (Clause 10 / WCAG 1.1.1 in export context): The NoodleTools authoring interface does not provide an alt text input field for images inserted into notecards. As a result, when notecards containing images are exported to Word (.docx) or RTF, the exported document does not include programmatic alt text for those images.	Open	Planned	Dec 2026	Users can manually add alt text to images in the exported Word or RTF document using Microsoft Word's "Edit Alt Text" feature or equivalent accessibility tools in their document editor.	This issue affects only exported documents containing user-inserted images. The NoodleTools web interface itself provides alt text for all platform-provided images and UI elements. No other exported content types are affected.

Additional Information:

NoodleTools has conducted a comprehensive accessibility review against WCAG 2.1 A & AA, WCAG 2.2 A & AA, Revised Section 508, and EN 301 549 standards (VPAT report date: April 2026). The vast majority of criteria are fully supported. Accessibility evaluation used automated tools (WAVE, Axe via Playwright, KIRO) and manual testing with NVDA screen reader and keyboard-only navigation. Users must enable the "Enable Full Accessibility" option in their user profile to activate full keyboard and screen reader accessibility features.
